Pennington Community Watch is a non-profit community based organisation which aims to improve the quality of life within our neighbourhood by minimizing preventable crime, promoting closer community ties and creating a safer community.

Our Strategic Vision is:

Our Strategic Mission
To encourage people to participate with and support Pennington Community Watch and the SAPS in the prevention of crime and the promotion of community safety to ensure a safe and secure Pennington community.

By joining and supporting the Pennington community watch with a monthly fee of R150-00 (or more if you choose too) You provide the means to:

- Supply additional security in the areas targeted by criminals.
- Increase visual policing on the streets by SAPS reservists with backup from a security company.
- Installation of camera network system.
- Increase security over holiday periods .
- Negotiate with security companies for lower response rates.

Benefits :

- Lower crime activity through better crime prevention methods.
- Sustained lower crime rate – lower insurance premiums.
- **Stable property value.**
- Areas managed by a single security company with negotiated lower rates and service level agreement in place.
- Return business from holiday makers .

Roll out plan:

- **100 members** - debit order platform is created.
- Purchase of 2 way radios and necessary equipment for patrollers and bush cameras for monitoring targeted areas.
- Targeted signing of members at a rate of 50 per month and introduction of an administrator
- **250 members** - first set of SAPS reservists are employed and purchase of a mobile vehicle for patrolling.(Quad bike or scrambler motor cycle)
- Negotiations with a security company for the area at a special rate.
- **375 members** – second set of SAPS reservist employed and purchase of second patrol vehicle.
- Setting up of PCW, SAPS, security control centre office.
- **+ 500 members** – introduction of surveillance system.
- Any surplus funds are put back into community projects.
